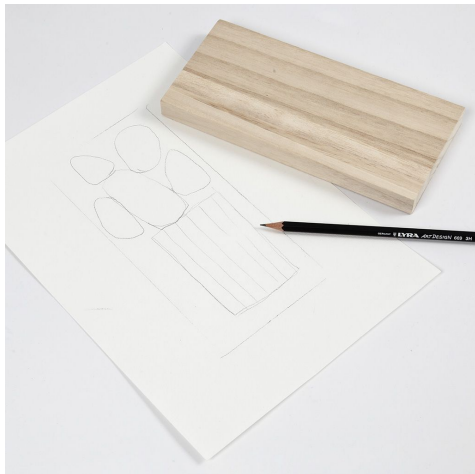




## A Design made with Drawing Gum and Watercolours

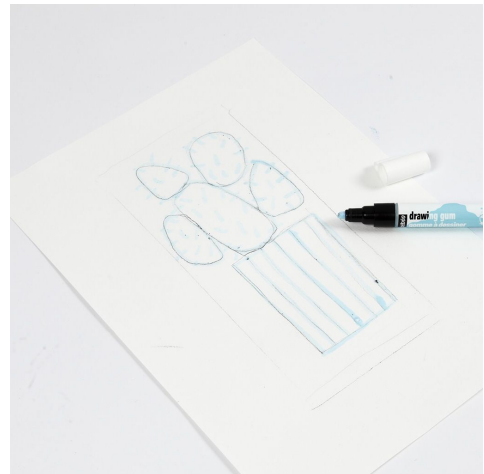
The sides of this wooden board are painted with Plus Color craft paint. A picture is attached onto the front. This is made using the masking technique on watercolour paper with drawing gum and liquid watercolours.

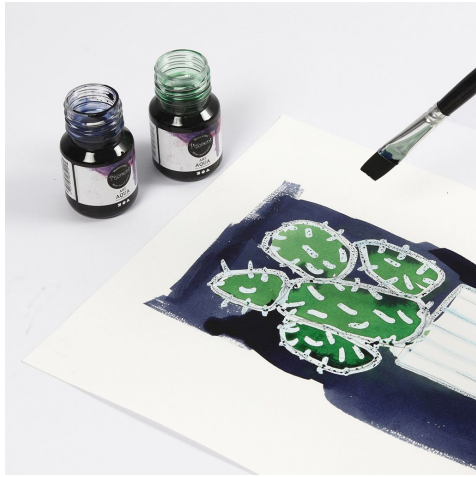
**1**

Draw the outline of the wooden board on a piece of watercolour paper. Draw a design on the watercolour paper using your imagination.



**2**

Outline the pencil design with drawing gum for masking. This prevents the paint penetrating the masked area of the paper.



**3**

Paint using liquid watercolours. Leave to dry.



**4**

Rub off the drawing gum coating using the tip of your finger. Trim the shape of the picture.



**5**

Paint the edges and the back of the wooden board with Plus Color craft paint (if you wish). Leave to dry.



**6**

Apply bookbinding glue to the back of the picture and attach it to the wooden board. NB: Bookbinding glue is ideal for gluing large, flat items (books, posters etc.) as the bond is strong and very flexible with an even and pleasant result.



## Another variant

Pictures made using the masking technique can be applied to other items, for example, on the back of the glass plate on coasters like these.
