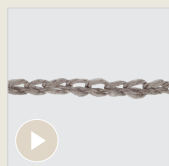
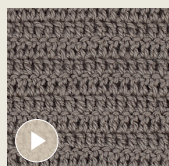


# Crocheted rose



Chain stitch.



Basic treble stitch.

Hank/string measure approx. 2 metres

- 1: Cast on 400 chain stitches.
- 2: Do 2 stitches from the needle and then crochet one slip stitch, then slip stitch along the edge of the border. Cut and sew the end.

The rose is approx. 8 cm in diameter (approx. 15 g of yarn)

- 1: Cast on 103 chain stitches.
- 2: Crochet 4 stitches from needle \*1 chain stitch, slip 2 stitches, 1 stitch\* repeat for the full row. You now have a small ladder with 35 steps. Turn the work over.
- 3: 2 chain stitches \*6 stitches in the space, 1 slip stitch in the next space\* repeat for the entire row until you have a total of 17 rose petals. Leave a long string of at least 50 cm for attaching and sewing on the brooch needle.
- 4: Carefully roll it up – but not too tight – and now use the other side of the ladder stitch design to assemble the rose. Carefully sew in a criss-cross on the back so that all the rose petals stick. Gently shape the rose petals.
- 5: Sew on to the brooch needle to finish.

## Abbreviations and symbols explanation

- s = stitch
- ss = slip stitch
- ch = chain stitch
- tr = basic treble stitch
- \*-\* = repeat from \* to \*
